1. Prairie Rivers Reconciliation Committee:

The next meeting of the Prairie Rivers Reconciliation Committee will be held on Tuesday, May 21, 2019 at the Batoche Historic Site from 9:00 a.m. to 11:30 a.m.

2. Water, Sewer and Waste Billing:

The utilities bills were mailed last week and the charges were as follows:

- ♦ Water \$84,099.95
- Sewer \$79,118.48
- Waste \$27,532.78

Total \$190,751.21

3. SAMA Open House:

On Monday, April 29, 2019 Appraiser Joelynne Doell and Appraiser Christie Lawrence, both from the Saskatchewan Assessment Management Agency (SAMA) attended the SAMA Open House and met with 6 affected property owners who wished to discuss their assessment. From this, 3 appeals were filed, which hopefully all can be dealt through an Agreement to Adjust.

4. Waste Reduction Council Meeting:

There will be a Waste Reduction Council meeting on Thursday, June 6, 2019 in Saskatoon commencing at 1:00 p.m. Aaron Baress from Loraas asked Chief Administrative Officer Jim Weninger to attend the meeting because the Town of Dalmeny was the first municipality in the Region to adopt a community wide organics program, however I am unable to attend. The Town of Osler has also started a community wide organics program.

5. Final Notice and Order to Remedy:

On March 13, 2019 ninety-nine letters were sent to property owners that according to records at MuniCode Services had outstanding building permit issues. Of these, approximately 55 outstanding building permits have been dealt with by the affected property owners. A Final Notice and Order to Remedy has been prepared and will be sent by registered mail to all property owners still with outstanding building permit issues. The deadline for these property owners to remedy the situation will be June 12, 2019. Property owners have the ability to appeal this order and must do so by 5:00 p.m. May 27, 2019.

6. Zoning Amendment Public Notice:

There will be another Public Notice advertised in the Clark's Crossing Gazette on May 16, 2019 and May 23, 2019 pertaining to increasing the height of accessory buildings in the CS – Community Service District. Council gave first reading to this amendment on April 15, 2019.

7. Municipal World Subscription Renewal:

I renewed the Town's subscription to Municipal World for a further year, the cost being \$46.00.

8. HELP International And Green Research & Discovery Corp:

Rodney Sidloski, CEO and Land Researcher has advised the Town that our trees are ready to be picked up at the end of May, beginning of June, 2019. Once received, these trees will be placed in the Town's Nursery.

9. Pre-Construction Meeting:

On Thursday, May 9, 2019 a Pre-Construction Meeting was held to discuss the Wakefield Avenue Road Reconstruction and South Industrial Asphalt Pavement Project. Representatives Adam Ruszkowski and Steve Chabaylo from Ruszkowski Enterprises Ltd, Carleen Bartel and Keith Schwark of Catterall & Wright Ltd. along with Jeff Johnson and Jim Weninger from the Town of Dalmeny toured each area. We also dug a hole on Wakefield Avenue to determine the depth of the black dirt underneath the paved surface, copy of which is attached.

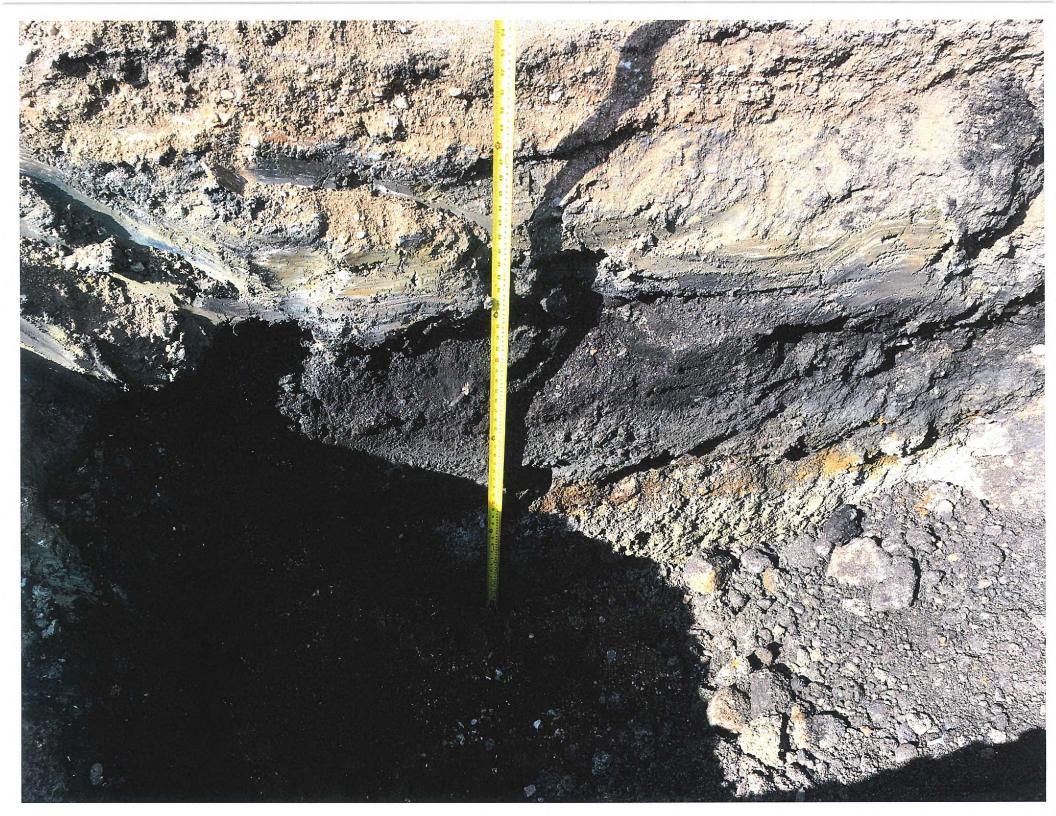
10. Street Name Changes:

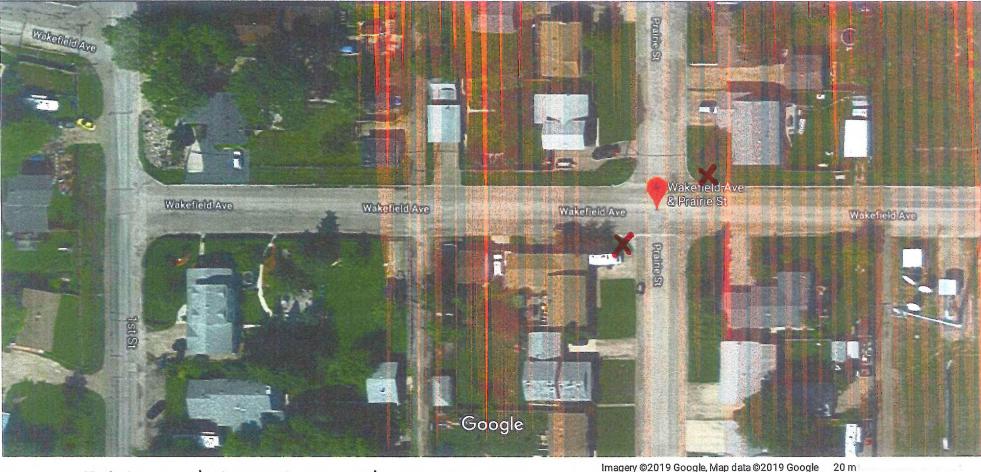
I am writing to request that the intersection of Prairie St and Wakefield Ave be re-evaluated for 4 way stop signs in place of the yield signs that are there now. With the increasing development in the north east end of town and the newer roads on Wall St. it seems there is a larger traffic load coming through the intersection of Wakefield and Prairie street. People driving East and West don't understand that drivers coming from the North and South have the right of way and often there are very close calls at this intersection. There is also a school, a park, and sports grounds in close proximity which also brings many vehicles heading through there on a daily basis. With all the foot traffic from these facilities and the misunderstanding of some drivers on who actually have the right of way at this intersection, it is my request that a 4 way stop be looked at so there is a clear definition on who has the right of way. The more time a driver has to react to situations at this intersection, the less dangerous it will be. There is a very similar intersection on Loeppkey Ave. where Wall St. turns into Victor Lane which has stop signs with no schools or parks in the area. There is also a similar intersection at Wakefield and 4th that is a 4 way stop that also has no parks or schools in the area. The traffic for these two examples compares to what comes through the Wakefield and Prairie St intersection
